Pacing Schedule for Incredible English 4

NOTES ON INCREDIBLE ENGLISH

There is far too much content in the Incredible English books to get through everything and you will need to be selective. You are required to cover approximately one unit per month and as such the outline below highlights how this can be approached through modifying the 10 lessons in the teacher's book.

UNIT STRUCTURE:

Wattsenglish Lessons	Lesson Aim	Description
LESSON 1: Lesson 1+Lesson 2	Introducing Vocabulary + Practising Vocabulary	Use flashcards or realia to make the children interested in the target vocabulary and play some TPR games to give some nonverbal practice. You should also complete the first 2 pages of the unit in the activity book, setting any unfinished work as homework.
LESSON 2: Lesson 3+Lesson 4	Story + Language Focus	Use the story in the class book (or appropriate contextual situation) to introduce and focus on the target structures and to give practice to the first structure presented.
LESSON 3: Lesson 5+Lesson 6 and / or 7	Play script + Reading and Writing (not first grade)	After practice of the second structure, the play script can be used to give the students some freedom to use the new vocabulary and language structures to use or for personal expression.
LESSON 4: Lesson 8+Lesson 12	Learning for Life (Song) / Learning through English + Review.	The final lesson should be used to put the target language into wider context / curriculum (usually through personal, social and health education) and as revision / consolidation lesson via written exercises etc.
